Fee is transferable to another Scout in Unit; no refunds are available. Campsite planning is made on February numbers; this can affect number of Scouts & adults able to register later due to campsite capacity. Webelos II->New Scouts can pay \$348 by May 16, then higher fee (estimate in February). Troop will have Summer Camp meeting for new parents in May.

Adults Adult fees are \$119 per week due May 16, (no day rate, leaders may share week)

Make checks out to Troop 944, and give to Chip Galloway. Note, there is no partial payment schedule; a full-fee is required to hold the space. Both Scouts and Adults **MUST** have medical-physicals on BSA Annual Health & Medical Record Form to Troop by June 6.

The camp is run by the Troop/Patrol Method for all activities. All Scouts and adults/leaders on site must be registered/insured with BSA.

New Scouts (and some Scouts under First Class) will participate in the "**Dan Beard**" program for rapid rank advancement.
